

Prescriptions for Prevention

Cockroaches

Did you know?

Exposure to cockroaches can cause asthma and allergy symptoms.

Action Plan

- Seal cracks and crevices with caulk so cockroaches cannot enter.
- Take away their food and water supply:
 - Don't leave food out.
 - Only leave pet food out while pets are eating.
 - Store food in airtight containers.
 - Clean all food crumbs or spilled liquids right away.
 - Wash dishes after use. Rinse recyclable containers.
 - Repair water leaks promptly.
 - Store garbage in a closed bin and remove daily.
- Decrease their hiding places by removing clutter.
- Use bait-traps or sticky traps instead of pesticide spray.
