Space Heater Safety

Did you know?

Space heaters cause an average of 1,700 fires and 80 deaths each year. If you are using a space heater, it is important to use it safely.

Action Plan

- Keep the space heater at least 3 feet away from curtains, furniture, or anything that can catch on fire. Never hang clothes over a space heater to dry
- Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the space heater to prevent burns or extreme heat exposure.
- Place the heater on a bare, uncarpeted floor. Do NOT place it on a table, rug, or other surface.
- Plug directly into a wall outlet. Do NOT use an extension cord or power strip, as this could lead to overloading and cause a fire
- Turn off or unplug the heater when not in the room and when sleeping.
- Gas/kerosene space heaters can cause a buildup of carbon monoxide, which can be deadly so they should not be used indoors. Never use gasoline in a space heater because it can explode.
- Make sure there is a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector on each level where you are using a space heater and on each level where people are sleeping. Ensure that the batteries are working.
- Space heaters should not be your main heating source.

Under Pennsylvania State law, tenants have the right to a livable apartment, which includes access to proper heating. Landlords are required to maintain proper heat and meet specific temperature requirements during the winter months.
